



APPLICATION TO THE OFFICE OF RAIL AND ROAD FOR A PASSENGER TRACK ACCESS CONTRACT, OR AN AMENDMENT TO AN EXISTING CONTRACT

ORR ensures that train operating companies have fair access to the rail network and that best use is made of capacity. If a train operator wants to access the national railway network, it will need a track access agreement with Network Rail which requires ORR's approval under the Railways Act 1993. When determining access to the network, we must have regard to our <u>statutory duties</u>, most of which are set out in section 4 of the Act. We must exercise our functions (which include the approval of access contracts) in a way that we consider best achieves those duties.

Use this form to apply to the Office of Rail and Road (ORR) for a passenger track access contract, or an amendment to an existing contract by a supplemental agreement, under sections 17-22A or the Railways Act 1993.

It sets out ORR's standard information requirements for considering applications. Our <u>track access</u> <u>guidance</u> (and our <u>making an application</u> guidance in particular) explains the process, timescales and the issues we will consider. Please read the guidance before completing the contract and this form.

If the facility owner and beneficiary have agreed terms, the facility owner should fill in the form. If not, the beneficiary should fill in the form.

A pre-application industry consultation is usually required before submitting an application. Please see the industry code of practice for track access application consultations for more information.

This form should be completed up to section 10 and sent to consultees along with a copy of the proposed contract or supplemental agreement. Sections 10 and 11 should be filled in after the consultation and before applying to ORR.

Please ensure that you are using the latest version of this form as published on our website. We may ask for applications which have not used the latest version to be resubmitted.

The additional service departing Liverpool at 16.13 will provide important relief capacity at a time when there is currently a high level of demand for travel which is expected to increase. The return working from Euston at 20.06 ensures that the 2tph pattern continues later into the evening, providing additional fast journey opportunities to stations in the Trent Valley.				

4.2 Capacity: How have you satisfied yourself that there is enough network capacity for the services in the proposal? Please include details on all relevant capacity considerations, including but not limited to track, platform availability, and power supply traction.

These services were incorporated in the timetables developed by the WCML Industry Planning Group (IPG) and Event Steering Group (ESG) workstreams, therefore, we know the capacity exists for these services.

AWC has worked closely with Network Rail in collaboration with other Operators, and has built its timetable on conclusions from the WCML IPG Final Report published in February 2021. The resulting Concept Train Plan, developed through the ESG, delivers a timetable structure that incorporates the services detailed in 4.1.

Power supply capacity modelling is currently being undertaken by Network Rail.

16:13 Liverpool Lime Street to London Euston calling at Runcorn, Lichfield Trent Valley and Tamworth Low Level.

The closest AWC Sunday services currently are the 16:43 and 15:43 services from Liverpool to Euston (1A53 and 1A47 respectively). Between period 2410 and mid-May 2024, 1A53 had an average On Time percentage of 71.0%, and an average T-3 of 80.7%. It was the 2nd best out of 14 Liverpool – Euston services on Sundays. 1A47 had an average On Time percentage of 51.7%, and an average T-3 of 65.2%, and was 10th out of the 14 services.

These two trains do not typically call at Lichfield or Tamworth, however. The later 20:43 service 1A72 does call at these stops, as well as Runcorn, Crewe, Stafford, Nuneaton, Rugby Milton Keynes and Watford Jn. Over the same time period, this service had an average On Time percentage of 54.0%, and an average T-3 of 71.0%. It was the 8th best performing out of the 14 Liverpool – Euston services on Sundays.

20:06 London Euston to Liverpool Lime Street calling at Tamworth Low Level, Lichfield Trent Valley and Runcorn.

The closest AWC Sunday services currently are the 19:42 and 20:39 services from Euston to Liverpool (1F36 and 1F38 respectively). Between period 2410 and mid-May 2024, 1F36 had an average On Time percentage of 45.5%, and an average T-3 of 66.2%. It was the 5th best out of 14 Euston - Liverpool services on Sundays.

1F36 does not typically call at Lichfield or Tamworth, however 1F38 does call at these locations. Over the same time period, 1F38 had an average On Time percentage of 46.4%, and an average T-3 of 57.1%. It was the 11th best performing out of the 14 Euston – Liverpool services on Sundays. It would be reasonable to assume similar performance for the new service.
